Gift Aids Blackford Band Uniform Drive

Town Financial Corp. and four of its affiliates provided a big boost in May to a fund drive to purchase new uniforms for the Blackford High School Band.

Acting on behalf of Bank Computer Services, City Savings Bank, First National Bank and The Bank of Montpelier, John R. Maddox Jr. presented a check for \$1,575 to the Blackford Bank boosters. The money will be used to purchase 15 new uniforms.

cared-for but are simply in need of replacement," said Bill McCammon, a member of the band boosters.

In keeping with the half century tradition of Blackford County bands, the new black and red uniforms feature military styling. According to Fiske, the coats are red, while the trousers, hats and plumes are in black. The uniforms are accented by a cross belt and silver buttons.

"We view this gift to the band as a part of our deep commitment to the Blackford County community," said John B. Maddox Jr., vice president Town Financial Corp. "The county ladways maintained a real strong band tradition and we hope this gift will help keep it going and growing."

Currently, the fund drive is just \$2,000 shy of its goal.
